

250 Dollars Reward!

Whereas **EDWARD CULLINANE**, Gold Miner of Bristol, Eng. and 34a Bonanza, Y.T., is believed to have died from physical exhaustion and starvation in the Teslin Lake district in July, 1913, the above sum has this day been deposited with the Bank of British North America, London, with instructions to pay at one of their Canadian branches the above sum for the recovery, identification as approved by authorities, and the reverent burial of the body of the said Edward Cullinane, and for the recovery of effects, jewellery, papers, etc., found upon, or near, the body. The reward will be paid out in exchange for the following documents:

- (1) Affidavit sworn before Authorities in Atlin, proving the finding of the body.
- (2) Receipt from the Gold Commissioner, Atlin, showing the due delivery to him of all effects, jewellery, papers, etc., found upon or near the body.
- (3) Certificate of death showing that the said Edward Cullinane died in July or August, 1913, together with an official copy.
